
Day 2 – Tuesday, October 13, 2026

Hotel Littré **** 3 Nights in Paris

Discreet and elegant away from the city hustle and bustle but still close to Paris life, tucked away in the street of the same name. Sites near the Hotel Littré include Montparnasse and Saint-Germain-des-Pres, a quick trip to the Bon Marché department store, or the Jardin du Luxembourg, Les Invalides and the Eiffel Tower.




Day 2 – Tuesday, October 13, 2026 – Welcome dinner at La Coupole.

This Art Deco brasserie was a legendary meeting place for artists, writers and intellectuals in the 1920s and 30s.

Some of the regulars included Ernest Hemingway, Jean-Paul Sartre Simone de Beauvoir, Picasso, Man Ray and Josephine Baker.

They serve seafood and traditional French dishes.







Day 3 – Wednesday, October 14, 2026

The Marais: Place de Vosges & Visit Victor Hugo's former residence.

Commissioned by Henri IV in early 1600s to be a grand, orderly square that symbolized stability and to attract the aristocracy to move back to Paris. It was used for royal celebrations tournaments and festivities.







Day 3 – Wednesday, October 14, 2026

Return to hotel before our dinner cruise.










Paris Through Art & Faith: Notre Dame, Impressionists & Montmartre – guided tour of the restored Notre Dame cathedral.








Day 4 – Thursday, October 15, 2026



Day 5 – Friday, October 16, 2026

Paris → Burgundy | Fontainebleau, Chablis & Dijon



En route, admire the exterior of Château de Fontainebleau, a royal residence for more than seven centuries. Originally built by King Francis I in the early 16th century. Expanded by the Henri's and the Louis's and finally by Napoleon Bonaparte as a “true residence of Kings.”

Continue to the Château Rosa Bonheur, former home and studio of the renowned 19th-century painter.



Day 5 – Friday, October 16, 2026

Paris → Burgundy | Fontainebleau, Chablis & Dijon



The Horse Fair (1852-1855) oil painting, by Rosa Bonheur at the Metropolitan Museum. Continue to the Château Rosa Bonheur, former home and studio of the renowned 19th-century painter.




Day 5 – Friday, October 16, 2026

Paris → Burgundy | Fontainebleau, Chablis & Dijon




Continue to Barbizon to the Château Rosa Bonheur (1822-1899), former home and studio of the renowned 19th-century painter. Preserved exactly as she left it, the château offers a moving glimpse into her artistic life. She played a pioneering role as a female artist and animal rights activist.






Stop in the famed wine village of Chablis for lunch and a visit to the historic Obédiencerie of Domaine Laroche, a former monastery (Monks of St Martin) and historic monument dating back to the 9th century where monks cultivated vines and made wines. It has been restored and now serves as the Domaine La Roche headquarters and historic cellars.

Day 5 – Friday, October 16, 2026

Arrive in Dijon for hotel check-in, followed by a welcome dinner near the hotel. Located in the center of Dijon, this hotel dates to the 15th century.

for 3 nights.






Day 6 – Saturday, October 17, 2026

Dijon: History, Architecture & Gastronomy

Palais des Ducs de Bourgogne, now home to City Hall and the Museum of Fine Arts, which we will visit, followed by a stroll in the medieval streets lined with half-timbered houses.



Day 6 – Saturday, October 17, 2026

Dijon: History, Architecture & Gastronomy

Admire Notre-Dame de Dijon, famous for its sculpted façade and the beloved Owl of Dijon, a symbol of good luck.

Learn about the city's Roman roots, ducal splendor, and revolutionary past. The tour concludes near Les Halles Market, designed by Gustave Eiffel. The rest of the day and evening on your own.





Day 7 – Sunday, October 18, 2026

Timeless Burgundy: Villages, Vineyards & Wine Tasting

Visit Flavigny-sur-Ozerain, one of France's most beautiful villages, famed for its abbey and Anis de Flavigny candies.


Continue to Semur-en-Auxois, a striking medieval town with Gothic architecture.

Day 7 – Sunday, October 18, 2026

Next, explore Châteauneuf-en-Auxois, a hilltop village crowned by a magnificent 12th-century château. Conclude the day with a wine tasting in Aloxe-Corton, sampling prestigious Burgundy wines while learning about the region's winemaking heritage. 35 minutes from Dijon.





Day 7 – Sunday, October 18, 2026

Wine Tasting in Aloxe-Corton: The day includes a stop in the prestigious Aloxe-Corton region for a wine tasting session. Here, you'll have the opportunity to taste some of Burgundy's finest wines and learn about the region's rich winemaking heritage. Return to our hotel, evening on your own. Last evening in Dijon.





Day 8 – Monday, October 19, 2026 - Burgundy at Its Finest: Grand Crus (top vineyards with limited production) & the city of Beaune.

After breakfast, depart Dijon for our journey through the legendary vineyards of Burgundy with photo stops at Château du Clos de Vougeot.




Day 8 – Monday, October 19, 2026

Next stop, enjoy guided tastings in Gevrey-Chambertin and at a prestigious Meursault winery, paired with a light lunch or countryside picnic. Continue our journey to the historic city of Beaune, once a Roman settlement and now a center for wine production and tourism.



Day 8 – Monday, October 19, 2026
Arrive in Beaune, heart of the Côte de Beaune.
From Meursault 6 miles. Savor another tasting
highlighting the region's elegant Chardonnays,
followed by a guided walking tour of Beaune's
historic center and a visit to the iconic Hospices
de Beaune. Founded in 1443 by the Chancellor
of the Duchy of Burgundy as a charitable
hospital to care for the poor and sick.




Day 8 – Monday, October 19, 2026

Day 9 – Tuesday, October 20, 2026

Beaujolais Heritage: Lunch & wine tasting: Visit the Hameau Dubœuf, France's first wine theme park and learn about the rich winemaking Beaujolais region before enjoying lunch at the Café des Deux Horloges, featuring regional cuisine.

Day 9 – Tuesday, October 20, 2026 - In the afternoon, visit Château de Saint-Point, former home of French author, poet and statesman Alphonse de Lamartine. Explore its elegant interiors, gardens, and restored chapel. Initially a moderate royalist, he was a leading figure in the 1848 French Revolution.


Château de Saint-Point & Chapel. **Alphonse de Lamartine** (born October 21, 1790, Mâcon, France—died February 28, 1869, Paris) is one of France's most Romantic poets and a key figure in the Romantic movement in France. Achieved notoriety for his lyrical poetry in *Méditations Poétiques* (1820) Return to hotel in Beaune.



Day 10 – Wednesday, October 21, 2026

Beaune → Paris: After breakfast at the hotel, we will drive north travelling through the scenic French countryside. We will make stops along the way arriving at our hotel in Paris in the early afternoon.
